

A Chance Meeting

I often ponder on the fact how a chance meeting or event can change the path your life is taking. I had always been into fishing, all be it for putting food on the table, but that all changed on the Australia Day weekend in 1984.

We were at the end of our annual three week camping holiday at Lake Conjola on the south coast and I was cleaning some freshly caught blackfish and noticed another angler cleaning fish that I was not familiar with just down from our tent. Seeing we were the only people catching fish it did not take long to strike up a conversation. The other angler was Bob McMahon and I found out the fish he was cleaning were yellowtail kingfish that he had caught outside.

Bob and his family had decided, at short notice, to spend the weekend away and being a long weekend, Lake Conjola was the first place that he could find on his way south that wasn't booked out.

As it turned out we both lived in the same area, with the McMahons at Moorebank and us at Cartwright.

During our chinwag Bob told me all about Sportfishing, ANSA and that he belonged to the St George Sportfishing Club. He also mentioned that the club was putting in a submission to the authorities re the poor condition of the Georges River. As it turned out I had recently had to do an assignment for teacher's college on the same subject and had a series of 35mm slides that I had taken.

I found out from Bob when the next meeting of the club was so that I could come along and see what it was all about.

It turned out to be a great night. I joined Sam and myself up on the spot and they gratefully accepted the 35mm slides I had on the Georges River.

Shortly after the club had a new members weekend at Greenwell Point, where members, in their own boats, took the new members and introduced us to outside fishing. We were teamed up with Peter Hopley (Hopeless) and Bev Cheffins. What an eye opener that was. We trolled up heaps of kingfish and striped tuna between Penguin Head and Kinghorn on little pink squids. How easy is this and how long has this been going on was my immediate thought. It was also where I was introduced to sand flies.

This then led up to many great days fishing with Bob in his boat. We had many great trips especially learning to catch snapper together off Kinghorn, although I can remember one occasion when Bob could not understand why I stopped catching snapper to fish for leatherjackets.

The next major event was the club's annual foray to South West Rocks. We took our tent and Bob allowed us to fish with him. What a great time was had. I caught my first ever jewfish, a lovely 17.5kg specimen taken on a live mullet that was scooped up in the landing net as we travelled down river in the dark.

Well as the boy says in the ad "We're going to need a bigger boat". That led to buying a 5.3m Savage Lancer just 12 months after joining the club.

This led to Bob doing a lot of fishing with us but I had to put up with Bob and Sam singing "Oh Lord it's hard to be humble" and eating cream buns.

That chance meeting way back in 1984 completely changed our direction in life and through St George we have made some great life-long friendships, had some fantastic times and retired to the lovely south coast.

St George Sportfishing Club is a fantastic family club that has introduced so many people to the pleasures of fishing and I am truly blessed to be a part of it.



A VERY Enjoyable Journey



I spent my younger days growing up in Herne Bay now known as Riverwood, where we used to fish, prawn and swim in Salt Pan Creek, around the rail bridge, as well as riding our bikes to Lugarno and the upper reaches of the Georges river to fish.

I fished the beaches of the south coast with my dad and his mates for some years, my first venture in boating was when dad bought a 10 foot ply clinker boat, and no motor could only afford oars.

When I joined St George I meet up with Bill Harvey who I had not seen for many a year, having been apprenticed under him at O'Donnell Griffin, when I left there he thought he had seen the last of me, no luck Bill I am still here.

My time with the club, 13 years as treasurer, club President 1-2 ? Times as well as being on the committee most enjoyable, you get back what you put in, great friends and mates for life.

Only to mention a few, Bill and Lillian Harvey, Les and Sue Waldock, Sam and Lloyd Anderson, please if I have not put your name down the page is not long enough.

One last friendship story I was approached in the early days of my time with the club at an outing at Greenwell Point boat ramp, this young lady came up to me and asked don't you remember me, the brain scrambles, no should I, yes remember when? That's another story hullo Sam Anderson.

This time in our life it is difficult to make it to the meetings, St George SFC remains the start of this very enjoyable journey that still continues today.

Fishing Reports

Hi Bill,

I have been doing some different fishing over the past few weeks. The weather and swell conditions have been variable which has caused me to try some different locations around Sydney. The rocks at Wattamolla are up and down with the water temperatures which are going from 21.5C to 23.5C on a daily basis. Lots of small kings (most undersize), tailor, salmon and luderick. Have also fished the rocks around Jibbon when the swell has been large for bream, tarwine, luderick, rock blackfish, trevally and mullet, all on bobby cork and bread.

Did night fish land based, in the Port Hacking the other night for a nice 80cm Mulloway caught squid strips .

Fished yesterday at Wattamolla and became caught in the fires. I did not realise there were fires until at around 2pm when some smoke started coming across the cliff behind me. This instigated a quick pack up of gear and exit from where I was fishing. I got as far as the car park and that's where I stayed until 7.30pm, when the road was opened to allow the cars to get out. Have not fished for sharks as the swell has been too big when the tides have been right for fishing.

Updated | Fisheries officials unconcerned after 3.5 metre bull shark is caught in Georges River

The Department of Primary Industries (DPI) responded to questions from the Leader after a 3.5 metre long bull shark was reeled in by two fishermen at Picnic Point on Wednesday.

Another large bull shark was found dead in the same part of the river late last year, and the owner of Mac's Bait Bar at Blakehurst, Andrew Lazarides, said several bull sharks that been caught in the Georges River over the last two weeks.

A DPI spokesman said, "It is not uncommon for bull sharks to frequent the Georges River during summer and autumn months (November to April) and sightings in this waterway indicate a healthy ecosystem".

"The maximum daily bag limit for bull sharks is one per day," he said.

Update

The two fishermen who caught a 3.5 metre bull shark in the Georges River have been identified as Hassan Alameri and Luke Moir.

Earlier

A large bull shark has been pulled from the Georges River at Picnic Point.

Two fishermen, who have not been named, caught the shark on Wednesday near Revesby Beach, and photos were posted on Facebook.

Mac's Bait Bar at Blakehurst, which reposted the first image from a closed Facebook group, said: "Caught

today picnic point. This time bigger than the last post mid December .. this one 3.5 metre bull. Approx 150kgs. They are there right under your noses people."

Andrew Lazarides, owner of Mac's Bait Bar, said several bull sharks that been caught in the Georges River over the last two weeks.

"The others were in the 2 to 2.5 metre range," he said.

"There are plenty there – we only hear about a small percentage.

"They could be anywhere from Captain Cook Bridge right up the back."

Mr Lazarides said the sharks would also be lurking in Botany Bay and people should be wary of swimming in open waters.

"During broad daylight, swimming is probably OK, but not at dusk or dawn or when they are feeding on bait schools," he said.

NSW Maritime issued a warning after a large bull shark was caught in the Georges River in November last year.

Update

State government fisheries officials are unconcerned about the number of large bull sharks being caught in the Georges River.

They say it indicates "a healthy ecosystem"



Seabird Of The Month



Little Tern, *Sternula albifrons*

Appearance. Size 21-24 cm, wingspan 50 cm. Australia's smallest tern. In **breeding plumage** the bill is yellow, usually with a black tip. The forehead is white, extending back over the eye. The cap is black, with an extension through the eye to the base of the bill. Legs are yellow, and wings pale grey. In **Non-breeding** plumage the bill and legs are black, forehead and crown are white and the black extension stops short of the bill.

Habitat and range. Coastal waters, bays, inlets, saline or brackish lakes, sewage ponds near coast. North from Shark Bay, WA then east and south around to eastern SA. In summer, in nw., n. and e. Aust., migratory Asian-breeding Little Terns in Non-breeding plumage mingle with local Little Terns in breeding plumage. Little Terns are scarce in se. Aust. in winter, as Asian birds depart and local birds apparently migrate coastally north. Little and Fairy Terns in se. and e. Aust. have suffered serious decline caused by beachgoers, dogs, vehicles intruding on beach nest sites. Please keep clear of any beach area where they gather. Observe warning notices.

Breeding. 1-2 eggs, stone-coloured, spotted, blotched dark brown, umber and grey; in scrape in sand or shell-debris. Easily disturbed, leading to breeding failure

Diet. Small fish, gathered by plunge-diving. Tend to hover, head-down.

Call. Male: hoarse whistles. Female: harsh rattling, usually in flight.

Anglers wishing to participate who are not affiliated with ANSA NSW are welcome to compete, but are not eligible to compete for Trophy Categories other than those indicated as Other Angler Trophy Categories. Nowra Sportfishing Club membership is available

1. ACCOMMODATION:

People requiring accommodation contact the Crookhaven Heads Tourist Park, phone 4447 2849 or toll free 1300733026 and book early.

2. CONVENTION COMMITTEE:

The Nowra Sportfishing Club Inc. Committee is sole adjudicators of all aspects of the Convention and Rules, their decision shall be final. However, you may seek clarification from the Australian National Sport Fishing Association (ANSA) if required.

3. ENTRY:

Made by submitting a completed entry form together with the appropriate fees or copy of EFT Receipt, as detailed on the entry form, to the Secretary, NOWRA SPORTFISHING CLUB INC, PO Box 2079, BOMADERRY NSW 2541

4. REGISTRATION:

Competitors must register at Convention Base located at Caravan Park, Crookhaven Heads prior to commencing fishing.

5. FISHING RULES:

Fish are to be Captured, Tagged and Released in accordance with ANSA Rules and Regulations as are in effect at the time of this convention, with the exception to the following:

 **1 kg line class will not be eligible in the Blue Water section of the convention.**

 **Rays are not eligible for this convention.**

 **Sharks are eligible for tag and release only.** (Sharks and Rays may be weighed for individual master points)

All lines, doubles, traces or leaders may be subject to measurement as weigh masters and recorders see fit. It is not the intention of this rule to cast aspersions on the integrity of the anglers.

6. CONVENTION BRIEFING:

A Convention Briefing will take place on Thursday 15th February 2018 at 8:00 pm at the Convention Base located at the Caravan Park for competitors regarding rules, weather conditions and restrictions on any events due to inclement weather.

7. CONVENTION BOUNDARIES:

Northern: due east of Blackhead, and Southern; due east of the entrance into Sussex Inlet.

8. FISHING TIMES AND WEIGH STATION PROCEDURES:

Fishing begins 6:00am on Friday 16th and may continue until twelve noon on Sunday 18th February 2018. The weigh station opens 4:00 pm Friday 16th and closes Sunday 18th February 2018 at 12:00 midday sharp.

To be eligible for convention points, fish or tags must be in the roped off area and under control of the Weighmaster by that time

9. PROTESTS:

Any protest must be in writing and handed to a member of the Nowra Sportfishing Club Inc. committee by no later than 12.30 pm Sunday. The Convention Committee's decision shall be final. All tackle involved in a protest shall be held by the Tournament Committee for further clarification until the protest is resolved.

10. POINT SCORE:

Capture Points awarded using the current ANSA Point Score System, to be eligible for convention points captures must score a minimum of 50 ANSA points. Juniors and sub-juniors must score a minimum of 30 points. The formula for the calculation of points is:

$$\frac{(\text{MASS (kg)} \times 100 \times \text{Factor})}{\text{LINE CLASS (kg)}}$$

Tag and release points are awarded in accordance with the ANSA system for tagging masters using game Fish tags on eligible species...

11. CONVENTION TROPHIES:

- 🏆 1 kg line class is not eligible in the Blue Water section of the convention.
- 🏆 It is the policy of the Nowra Sportfishing Club Inc. that **“ONE FISH ONE TROPHY”**.
- 🏆 Anglers must nominate the section they wish to enter their fish in, e.g. Open, Lady, Junior or Sub-junior. Final decisions on all awards shall be at the discretion of the Convention Committee, whose decision shall be final.

12. CONVENTION TROPHY CATEGORIES:

BLUEWATER GAME: This trophy is for the highest point scoring capture by an angler fishing from a vessel anywhere outside enclosed waters. **The waters inside Jervis Bay are offshore waters and shall be included in this section.**

ROCKS:

This trophy is for the highest point scoring capture by an angler fishing from a rocky outcrop, ledge or headland anywhere on the oceanfront. The rocks inside Jervis Bay shall be included in this section. **FOR SAFETY PLEASE WEAR LIFE JACKETS**

ESTUARY:

This trophy is for the highest point scoring capture by an angler fishing from the shore or vessel in estuary waters, saltwater creeks, lagoon and salt marshes up to the beginning of non-tidal freshwater.

BEACH:

This trophy is for the highest point scoring capture by an angler fishing from sand or gravel beaches, coves and bars anywhere on the oceanfront. **The beaches inside Jervis Bay shall be included in this section.**

CATCH & RELEASE LENGTH ONLY

These trophies are competed for an individual angler basis only. All fish must be of legal size.

The eligible species are Snapper, Bream, Flathead, Australian Salmon and Luderick.

All fish are required to be measured & released in good health.

Proof of catch and release will consist of a photo of the fish laying on an approved measuring mat clearly showing the full fish and measurement. The photo must be presented to the weights recorder at time of entering the fish.

LADIES:

This trophy is for the highest point scoring capture by a lady angler fishing from the shore or a vessel. **Should a lady angler win any of the open sections, she shall not be eligible for this trophy with the same fish.**

JUNIOR:

This trophy is for the highest point scoring capture by any angler less than 16 years of age at the time of the capture. **Should a junior angler win any of the open sections, she/he shall not be eligible for this trophy with the same fish.**

SUB-JUNIOR:

This trophy is for the highest point scoring capture by any angler less than 10 years of age at the time of capture. **Should a sub-junior angler win any of the open sections, she/he shall not be eligible for this trophy with the same fish.**

CHAMPION CLUB:

This trophy is for the club with the highest aggregate point score. Aggregate point scores will be evaluated as follows:

- 🏆 The five (5) highest point scoring fish in each section are awarded points on a 5-4-3-2-1 basis.
- 🏆 Tag and release shall be the five (5) highest point scoring anglers.
- 🏆 Points awarded in each section shall be totalled, the club having the highest aggregate shall win.

MOST MERITORIOUS CAPTURE:

This capture will be decided upon by the convention committee. It need not be a winner of any section. The tackle, conditions and any extenuating circumstances will be considered in the decision, so please give the recorder all details of capture.

TAG & RELEASE:

This trophy is competed by an individual angler. The angler with the highest tag & Release aggregate point score wins, except Champion Club where it shall be five (5) highest point scoring anglers.

NON-ANSA AFILIATED ANGLERS:

This trophy is for the highest point scoring capture by an angler fishing from land or vessel, in estuary waters, saltwater creeks, lagoon and salt marshes up to the beginning of non-tidal freshwater.

14. TIED RESULT:

With exception to the "Champion Club" category, "FIRST PAST THE POST" resolves a tied result.

15. CONVENTION CIRCUIT CATEGORIES:

The six (6) angling categories for the convention circuit for this convention are:

Blue Water, Game, Rocks, Estuary Beach, Ladies, Junior

SAFETY:

The seaworthiness of vessels is the responsibility of the Captains and their crews. Vessels putting to sea do so at their own risk. All vessels must comply with the safety requirements as laid down at any time by the Roads and Maritime Authority Any "Skipper" and Crew not complying with the regulations will risk disqualification.

WEAR LIFE JACKETS when fishing from rock platforms that are subject to tide and wave action.
